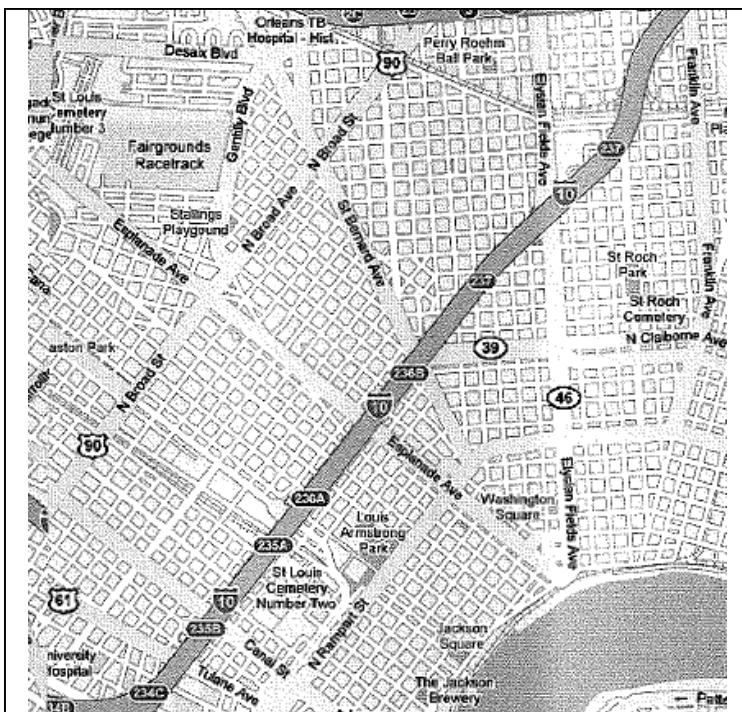

This edition of the resource guide was compiled for use in the Treme - 7th Ward community and includes some resources beyond their historic borders. The area covered extends roughly between Canal & Franklin, and from N. Broad to the Mississippi River. We have also included some listings for statewide & national agencies that assist people in connecting with local services. Out of area listings are marked with an asterisk (*).

Our intention with our resource guides is to increase public access to services that are free or low-cost. Most agencies that state they have a sliding scale require proof of income (i.e. check stubs, W2 forms, letter from person supporting you and their check stub, etc.). Usually they will require an ID and/or a utility bill to verify your address. If you have a question about costs, services or eligibility, call ahead.
